

Beverly Blvd Mainline Project

The Beverly Blvd Mainline Project is an important part of LADWP's plan to accelerate the pace of replacing aging infrastructure. The existing pipeline was installed in 1924 and recent multiple leaks has prioritized the replacement of this pipeline.

Benefits from the new mainline pipe include improved water service and enhanced fire protection for the community and greater reliability and operational flexibility for LADWP.



Project Description

The existing cast-iron pipeline will be replaced with new 6, 8, and 12-inch ductile pipe to strategically improve the infrastructure in the area and ensure water reliability.

Construction Information

LADWP will replace 13,360-feet of existing pipe along Beverly Blvd from Alvarado St to Glendale Blvd, and their cross streets, in phases. For the safety of the work crews and the community, construction will require temporary lane reductions and some intersection closures.

To minimize impacts to the community, crews will work in phases (see map).

- Phase 1: March 2023 July 2023
- Phase 2: Aug 2023 Nov 2023
- Phase 3: Dec 2023 July 2024

At the end of each work day, steel plates will cover the excavated areas.

Service interruptions will be needed to make water main connections. LADWP will provide a 48-hour notification prior to service interruptions.

Work will be performed from 9:00 pm to 9:00 am, Monday through Friday. Occasional Saturday work may be needed.

Upon project completion, the work area will be paved.

Traffic and Parking

Street parking will be restricted in the work zone during construction hours. Driveways will remain accessible. Throughout construction, temporary tow-away/no parking signs will be posted as needed. Access to businesses and the surrounding neighborhood will be maintained throughout construction.
