

UPPER STONE CANYON RESERVOIR WATER QUALITY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Construction Notice



Project Description

As noted in previous mailings and community meetings, LADWP is beginning work at the Upper Stone Canyon Reservoir (USCR). The USCR Water Quality Improvement Project will include installation of a 700,000 square foot floating cover, partially relining the surface of the reservoir, side slopes, modifying the reservoir inlet and outlet structures, reconstruction of the roadway and construction of an 800 square-foot control building.

Project Benefits

- Protect water quality and meet drinking water regulations through installation of a floating cover over the reservoir.
- Enhance water storage reliability through reservoir facility and property improvements.
- Improve area fire protection by upgrading two existing helicopter landing pads utilized by the City of Los Angeles Fire Department.

Construction Information

Initial construction will consist of mobilization, onsite utility work, slope stabilization, demolition, and removal of shade balls from the reservoir. All construction will be performed within the Reservoir property. While noise and dust can be expected as part of a large construction project such as this, the impacts are expected to be minimal and LADWP will make every effort to reduce impacts to the neighboring community. In addition, LADWP will work with the contractor to ensure compliance with the requests made by the local community to reduce traffic impacts.

Construction Schedule

July 2017 - Summer 2019

Hours of work will be Monday through Friday from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. Some Saturday work may be required.
