

Roles & Protocols




Purpose of the Steering Committee:

Provide strategic and technical direction to LA100 Equity Strategies through the identification of prioritized energy equity outcomes and play a critical role in broader community engagement to ensure community members are involved in the process.



Role of the Advisory Committee:

Provide input, ideas, comments, perspectives, and feedback on the feasibility of strategies and approaches identified by the Steering Committee and identify Equity Strategy priorities that intersect with other City departments' programs and/or have potential for multi-benefit programs and partnerships with other City departments.

Don't hold back on **scope**; equity strategies should be cross-sectoral



Cost, affordability, and utility burdens are *crucial challenges*



LA's infrastructure is a limitation (e.g., rooftop conditions)

Steering Committee Member Meetings What We Heard



Community-tailored and **long-lasting engagement** is *essential* to centering justice



Co-designing engagement *with* **community-based organizations** is key to developing **trusted relationships**



Equity tenets should drive program design & development



The stories we tell matter; **develop messaging that speaks to** *everyday life*



Develop an **energy equity language** that is *mutually intelligible*



Seamlessly integrate Equity Strategies across the city as part of a *holistic* approach



Scale up existing strategies, including LADWP programs



Energy-related burdens are *intersectional* (i.e., public health, transit, & career development)



Strategies need to be **long-term**, considering **socio-geographic difference** & **co-benefits**



Co-develop trust, mutual understanding, & rapport

Equity Strategies: Affordability, Revenue and Ratemaking

Energy burden and policy solution analysis

- 10+ years of experience working on engaged-affordability, rate & revenue and energy incentive policy designs and evaluations
- LCI alone, has worked with LADWP on 5+ projects under the UCLA-LADWP MOA
- Multi-year collaboration with community-based organizations involved the emPOWER platform and members of the RePower coalition on affordability and debt issues in L.A.
- Expertise on public utility models and structures, in a position to understand the challenges electrification poses to the traditional utility model and impacts on rate structures



Equity Strategies: Transportation

Transportation electrification and equitable mobility strategies

- Over 30 years of experience analyzing household transport affordability, traffic and mobility patterns in the Los Angeles region
- Active collaborations with LA Metro to develop policies for equitable mobility
- 10+ years developing tools and models for local, regional & state agencies and advocates for scenario planning to develop equitable strategies that increase zero emission transport access and improve health outcomes in disadvantaged communities
- Ongoing projects in the region exploring equitable transportation infrastructure that include alternative modes



Equity Strategies: Housing and Buildings

Energy use, household energy burdens & arrears, community solar opportunities

- 10+ years of active collaboration with LADWP, including projects under the UCLA-LADWP MOA
- CCSC Energy Atlas provides detailed understanding of the current electricity and natural gas use of buildings, correlated with socio-demographic data and building characteristics, to understand the needs for electrification
- Developed public facing tools and materials
- Deep understanding of energy burden and inequality within disadvantaged communities
- Ongoing projects on solar potential in L.A. County and potential for Distributed Energy Resources and community solar installations

Equity Strategies: Jobs, Workforce & Business Development

Economic impact of electrification in the region and beyond

- Over 20 years of experience at the forefront of issues of equity and access in the L.A. region
- Previous and ongoing projects to better understand the challenges and needs of minority-owned small businesses in the region
- Previous work spans important geographic regions, encompassing both local and non-local sources of LADWP power generation
- Experience evaluating the impacts of transition to electrification on workforce and developing strategies for just transitions



Equity Strategies: Health and Air Quality

A cross-cutting theme that reflects the wide-reaching implications of an equitable renewable energy transition

- Over 20 years of experience in the LA region working on air pollution and health
- Influential research helped shape air quality standards and regulations in the region
- Ongoing projects monitoring indoor and outdoor air quality
- Ongoing projects to understand and map urban heat island effect in collaboration with community organizations
- Extensive experience in collaborative research to identify and quantify co-benefits associated with renewable energy implementation




Energy justice



(Initiative for Energy Justice)


