

LOS ANGELES DEPARTMENT OF WATER AND POWER EASTERN SIERRA LAND USE

The Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP) owns and manages approximately 310,000 acres of land in Inyo and Mono Counties to protect the watershed for the citizens of Los Angeles and the Eastern Sierra. To provide recreational opportunities for the public, the LADWP keeps most of its land open for fishing, hiking, hunting, bike riding, nature studies, photography and other activities. LADWP land is used for campgrounds, parks, baseball and soccer fields, golf courses, and many other uses. Illegal activities on LADWP property are not allowed and will be reported to law enforcement. Such activities pose a significant threat to the environment such as fire, resource damage, water pollution and littering.

The public is welcome to enjoy DWP land. To protect the environment, please observe the following guidelines:

- Practice responsible outdoor use by caring for the land, water and wildlife, and removing litter.
- Fishing and hunting are open except where posted, subject to California Department of Fish and Game regulations.
- Overnight camping and campfires are allowed only in designated campgrounds to help prevent wildfires and for sanitation purposes.
- Off-road vehicle use is limited to existing roads away from residential areas. Please park vehicles in existing parking areas.
- Gates should be left as found (either open or closed) when entering ranch and range lands. All areas not open to the public are posted.
- Do not alter or damage any fencing, gates, signs or other structures.
